**REPORT ON THE STATUS OF CONVENTIONS AND OTHER MULTILATERAL  
INSTRUMENTS IN RESPECT OF WHICH THE ORGANIZATION PERFORMS  
FUNCTIONS**

**Note by the Secretary-General**

**SUMMARY**

*Executive summary:* This document updates the status information to 9 June 2003.

*Action to be taken:* Paragraph 5

*Related documents:* C 90/4

1 Since the preparation of document C 90/4, certain changes to the status of conventions and other instruments listed in the annex thereto have taken place.

2 The information on developments since 1 March 2003 in respect of acceptances of instruments is given in tabular form in the annex to this document. The annex thus supersedes the table appended to the annex to document C 90/4.

**ADOPTION OF NEW INSTRUMENTS**

**Protocol of 2003 to the International Convention on the Establishment of an International Fund for Compensation for Oil Pollution Damage, 1992**

3 The International Conference on the Establishment of an International Fund for Compensation for Oil Pollution Damage, held in London from 12 to 16 May 2003, adopted the Protocol of 2003 on the Establishment of an International Fund for Compensation for Oil Pollution Damage, 1992. The Protocol will be open at IMO for signature from 1 July 2003 to 30 June 2004, and thereafter remain open for accession, in accordance with the provisions of article 19. In accordance with article 21 of the Protocol, it will enter into force three months following the date on which 8 States have either signed it without reservation as to ratification, acceptance or approval, or have deposited instruments of ratification, acceptance or approval with the Secretary-General and the Secretary-General has received information that persons liable to contribute to the Supplementary Fund have received at least 450 million tons of contributing oil during the preceding calendar year.

4 Any further developments which occur after the issue of this document will be reported to the Council in an appropriate manner.

For reasons of economy, this document is printed in a limited number. Delegates are kindly asked to bring their copies to meetings and not to request additional copies.

5 The Council is invited to take note of the information contained in this document and its annex and to comment or decide as appropriate.
