

Regulations Amending the Swedish Transport Agency's Regulations and General Advice (2012:113) on the General Charge Compensation System for Security Checks of Passengers and their Baggage;

Decision reached on 28 June 2018.

The Swedish Transport Agency stipulates, with support of Section 4 of the Ordinance (2004:1101) on Aviation Security, regarding the Agency's Regulations and General Advice (TSFS 2012:113) on the General Charge Compensation System for Security Checks of Passengers and their Baggage, that Sections 3 and 7 have the following wording.

Section 3 The air carriers stated in Section 1 are obliged to pay a fee for security checks of passengers and their baggage. The charge shall be SEK 41 per passenger, with the exception of:

1. passengers in transfer;
2. passengers in transit;
3. children under two years of age;
4. crew members, when performing their duties in the airline's own airplane; and
5. passengers, in the event of a re-start after the aircraft has returned to the airport due to technical problems or adverse weather.

Section 7 The cost data shall include direct and overhead costs pertaining to the airport's security checks of passengers and their baggage, in accordance with Regulation (EC) No 300/2008 of the European Parliament and of the Council. The following applies to the calculation of the cost data:

1. Overhead costs shall be calculated as 8 % of the sum of the direct costs, unless it can be demonstrated that the overhead costs will be higher than that.
2. Capital costs shall be calculated with an interest rate corresponding to the Swedish central bank the Riksbank's repo rate plus 2 percentage units, unless it can be demonstrated that the actual capital costs are higher than that.

This statute enters into force on 1 September 2018
