# Similarities between Part-21 subpart F and G

- Handbook/Production manual describing:
- Arrangement with DOA/STC-/TC-/ETSO-holder.
- Production procedure
- System for occurrence reporting to EASA/CA and design org.
- Internal reporting system
- Control system of Suppliers

# Some of the differences between subpart F and G

## F - organisation

- Letter of agreement/from the CA
- CA is a part of the organisations quality system.
- Description in the handbook regarding production inspection system
- Validate by a product audit and counter-signature of Form1 by CA
- Approval not exceeding 1 year

## G - organisation

- Approval from CA
- POA has its own quality system
- POA is alone responsible for product audit and to sign Form 1
- Continuing POA-approval

# S-CAA conclusion when to use F- org

Shall be used for production of parts and appliances with no special processes and which are easy to inspect at the end of production.

Can only be used for a low production, and will be more expensive for larger and frequent production at the F-organisation (product audit and counter-signature of Form 1 by CA).

For production easy to plan. If frequent counter-signature of Form 1 is needed it can be difficult for an inspector to come and perform a product audit the day/week that the F-organisation has a need for a Form 1-release.
